Rabbi Anthony Fratello

Rabbi Anthony Fratello, Temple Shaarei Shalom, graduated from Pomona College in 1994, with a BA in History, and then began his studies toward the Rabbinate at the Jerusalem Campus of the Hebrew Union College.
